Mrs Emery - Au Revoir!

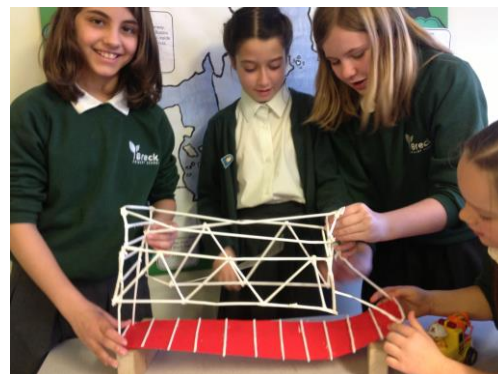

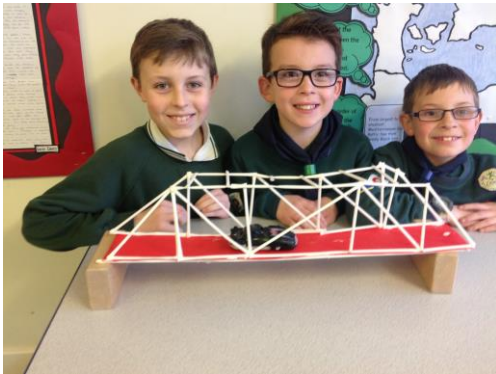
Film Night
